- Understanding the socio-political context that influenced the evolution of press laws in the country.

Legislative Process Understanding


- Knowledge of the basic legislative process and how a bill progresses into becoming an act.
- Familiarity with the stages involved, from proposal to enactment.

Constitutional Familiarity

- Basic understanding of the Indian Constitution, especially Article 19(1)(a) and Article 19(2).
- Awareness of the constitutional provisions related to freedom of speech and expression, and the reasonable restrictions imposed.
