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Technical Skills of Basic Photo Editing

- Adjusting Exposure: Balance brightness and contrast for optimal tonality.
- Color Correction: Fine-tune color balance and saturation for accurate representation.
- Cropping and Composition: Refine framing and remove distractions to improve composition.
- Sharpening and Noise Reduction: Enhance detail and reduce noise for a polished look.
- Basic Retouching: Remove imperfections and blemishes to enhance overall aesthetics.

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Basic Terminology of Photography

- Aperture: The opening in the lens that controls the amount of light entering the camera.
- Shutter Speed: The duration for which the camera's shutter remains open, determining the exposure time.
- ISO: The sensitivity of the camera's sensor to light, affecting the brightness and graininess of images.
- Focal Length: The distance between the lens and the camera's sensor, influencing the angle of view and magnification.
- Depth of Field: The range of distance in a scene that appears acceptably sharp in an image.

- Composition: The arrangement of visual elements within the frame to create a balanced and aesthetically pleasing image.
- White Balance: The adjustment of color temperature to ensure accurate color reproduction under different lighting conditions.
- Exposure: The overall brightness or darkness of an image, determined by the combination of aperture, shutter speed, and ISO.
- Histogram: A graphical representation of the tonal distribution in an image, helping to assess exposure and tonal range.
- RAW: A file format that stores unprocessed image data captured by the camera sensor, providing maximum flexibility for editing.
